

The Government allocate additional funding each year aimed at supporting pupils who are:

- Eligible for Free School Meals
- Looked after by the Local Authority
- The children of Armed Service personnel

Data collected from schools in January each year, is used to determine the amount of funding a school will receive based directly on eligibility on that given date. Schools decide how the premium is allocated as they are best placed to determine what additional provision should be made.

Our pupil premium allocation for 2012/13 was £29,712. The school uses this sum to subsidise our provision.
