Action Plan 2021-2022









Eco-Schools Topic:

Litter

Aim:

Reduce litter in our school community.

Action(s):

Whole school Waste Week activities.

Link to Woodland and Rainforest topic, impact of litter on wildlife and the environment.

Community, Governors and Eco-Council to complete school grounds and local area litter pick.

How long will it take?

Posters to be completed during Waste Week in March.

Wider impact of where litter may end up and the impact during topic teaching in Spring term.

Litter pick to take place in Spring term.

Who is responsible?

Eco-Council to choose best posters to display around the school.

KS1 Teachers – links to topic. KS1 Leader to organise litter pick with local community volunteers.

How we will monitor progress:

We will count competition entries for posters and display.

We will evidence learning of wider impact linked to topic on Tapestry.

We will take before and after photos of litter pick and weigh litter collected.

Evaluation:

Waste week was successful – 7 bags of rubbish collected. Stronger relationships between children and Governors. Eco Council shared success with school.

Eco-Schools Topic:

Transport

Aim:

To encourage sustainable and environmentally friendly transport to school and for the children to learn about the impact of different modes of transport on the environment.

Action(s):

Log activity of walking to school through WOW, celebrate success in achievement assembly. Walk to school week. Happy Shoesday Road Safety Show Links to topic – learn about modes of transport and their impact on the environment.

How long will it take?

Ongoing – WOW – monthly reports, celebrate success in achievement assemblies through badges and the mascot Strider.

Walk to school / Happy Shoesday – by end of Summer 1

Road Safety Show – end of Spring 2 Topic link – end of Spring 2.

How we will monitor progress:

Reports from WOW
Participation – Happy Shoesday
Photos and impact of Road safety Show
Evidence on Tapestry of topic links

Evaluation:

WOW has been successful – children love to collect badges. Monthly award for winning class – Strider the mascot. Bikeability course for less confident riders, now independent and cycling to school. Learnt impact of different modes of transport through topic work.

Eco-Schools Topic:

Waste

Aim:

Reduce waste, encourage recycling and increase reusing in the school and the community.

Action(s):

Take part in Waste Week.
Increase recycling
incentives within the school.
Make links with the
community to reduce waste.
Organise swap shops.

How long will it take?

Waste Week in Spring Term Increase recycling incentives by end of Summer term.

Swap shops throughout the year.

Who is responsible?

Class teachers – teach children about how waste has impact on climate change. Eco-Council teach school about Carbon footprint. Deputy Head – organise opportunities locally for community waste project.

Leadership team to organise Swap

How we will monitor progress:

Increased awareness of waste management within the school. Local links made with focus on waste. Success of swap shops. Photos.

Evaluation:

All children in school took part in Waste Week, learnt the story 'Carbon Monster' and what it means, Eco-Council placed Carbon Footprints around school. Links made with R G Carters, Eco slabs made to reduce concrete waste and now have boxes in school to recycle batteries and ink cartridges.
